## Economic Development

### Wyandot County Location and Topography

Wyandot County, Ohio is located in the northwest central part of Ohio. It was established on February 3, 1845 from lands previously occupied by the Wyandot Indian tribe and derives its name therefrom. It occupies approximately 406 square miles of gently rolling farmland.

Wyandot County enjoys four seasons with both moderate summers (average July temperature of 73 °F) and moderate winters (average January temperature of 35 °F). Average annual rainfall totals 35 inches.
