



Education in Wyandot County

There are three public school systems located in Wyandot County: Upper Sandusky Exempted Village School District, Carey Exempted Village School District and Mohawk Local School District (Sycamore), while parts of other districts (Riverdale, Wynford, and Ridgedale) fall within Wyandot County as well. In addition, two parochial schools, St. Peter's Catholic School in Upper Sandusky and Our Lady of Consolation in Carey serve students from kindergarten to 6th grade.

Wyandot County schools spend **\$9,976 per student** (The US average is \$12,383). There are **17 pupils per teacher**, **920 students per librarian**, and **443 children per counselor**.
